NWEA VCG Reports

Virtual Comparison Groups Reports, reports that examine student academic growth and compare that growth to students who perform similarly and share similar demographic characteristics.

During the 2014-2015 School Year, CICS West Belden Students exceeded their VCG Cohort by a Mean Growth Difference of 4.05 points in Reading and 4.69 points in Math. In Reading- 71.8 % of Students met proficiency levels and in 76.2% of students met proficiency levels in Math.

Selective Enrollment

Selective Enrollment High Schools provide academically advanced students with a challenging college preparatory experience. Students must meet minimum eligibility requirements in order to apply. Eligibility is based on the student's NWEA MAP scores in reading and math.

Over the past Three Academic School Years- 1/3rd of CICS West Belden's 8th Grade Graduates have been accepted to Selective Enrollment High Schools throughout the City of Chicago.

2015 Illinois 5Essentials Survey

The Illinois 5Essentials Survey asks students and teaches questions about their school's culture and climate.

According to the survey results where 99.9% of Students and 99.9% of Teachers participated, CICS West Belden's performance has been consistently aligned to the highest level of performance from the 5Essentials Reporting Metrics.
