



## Chronology, Summer 1966:

### 1. Saturday July 30th

March from New Friendship Baptist Church to real estate offices at a Chicago Lawn.

### 2. Sunday July 31st

Prayer vigil, planned for Methodist Church at Chicago Lawn. Walk from Marquette Park to the church.

### 3. Wednesday August 3rd

Vigil at real estate office in Belmont-Cragin.

### 4. Friday August 5th

March to real estate offices in Chicago Lawn, led by Dr. King, who was hit by a rock in Marquette Park.

### 5. Sunday August 7th

Prayer vigil in Belmont-Cragin, and prayer at two churches and a real estate office.

### 6. Friday August 12th

March to real estate offices in Bogan. There were also 1,000 policemen, 5,000 spectators.

### 7, 8, and 9. Sunday August 14th

Marches to real estate offices in Gage Park, also to Bogan and Jefferson Park.

### 10. Tuesday August 16th

Picketing at six real estate offices in Jefferson Park, 7 p.m. to midnight.

### 11, 12, and 13. Sunday August 21st

Marches to real estate offices in South Deering (in the city) led by Dr. King, and Evergreen Park and Chicago Heights (suburbs).

### 14. Tuesday August 23rd

March to real estate offices in South Deering.

### 15. Wednesday August 24th

March to real estate offices in West Elsdon.

### 16. Thursday August 25th

March in Belmont-Cragin after dark.
