

What We Heard

- Desire for high quality continuum of school options from PreK-12 in the Near South community.
- Need for a neighborhood high school in the Near South Community. Students currently travel too far for High School.
- Desire to maintain NTA ES and the strong culture it has created.
- Need for additional capacity at South Loop ES to alleviate overcrowding.
- Desire for additional details on proposal, including conversion timeline and high school boundaries.


In Contrast to Elementary Options, There Are Few High School Options



As a Result, High School Students in the Near South Area Travel All Across Chicago to Attend Their School of Choice


Facts and figures

- High school students in the Near South area attend 127 different high schools.
- Only 8% of high school students in the Near South area attend their neighborhood high school.
- 57% of high school students in the Near South area travel more than 3 miles to attend school.




Current Near South High School Enrollment

- High school students in the Near South area that are zoned to Tilden, Phillips or Wells as their neighborhood high school:
 - Attend their neighborhood school at much lower rates than the district average
 - Are more likely to travel 3 or more miles to attend school than the district average

CPS' Priorities for Near South Community

- Ensure high quality continuum of neighborhood school options for all PreK-12 students in the Near South area
- Create **sufficient capacity** of high quality seats for the growing student population.
- Build diverse school communities into a set of high quality PreK-12 schools

Proposed Changes for New South Loop Building

New, state-of-the art Elementary School for Near South Community

South Loop ES will have three buildings

Expand South Loop boundary to 22nd Street

Proposed Changes for New High School

NTA gradually converts to HS.


ALL current NTA students can attend South Loop regardless of where they live.

Older students can stay and graduate from NTA.




Phasing In New High School

Continuum of High Quality PreK-12 Options





High School Boundaries Process and Reference Point for Feedback

Timeline for Proposed HS Boundary

- At this point in the process, given that we have not made any decisions, it is too early to propose boundaries.
- Boundaries for new schools are typically not proposed until about one year prior to a new school opening.
- We will use our study area as a reference point for feedback.

Building More Diverse Schools

 If NTA were converted to a high school, South Loop and NTA students would be combined in one of the most diverse and high achieving schools in Chicago

Building More Diverse Schools

 If NTA is converted to a high school, the new Near South High School would be one of the most diverse schools in Chicago.

Other Options Considered

Build new high school on vacant land.

Repurpose new SLES building for high school.


Proposed Continuum for Students in Near South Area




