Protect Our Parks uses its privilege to fight community progress; enough is enough

CHICAGO – Today, the U.S. District Court hearing the case for the future of the Obama Presidential Center dismissed the case from federal jurisdiction. Opponents now have two options – they can appeal to the Supreme Court or they can bring their case to the Illinois state courts instead. As we await word about their next oppositionist attempt to delay the project, a coalition of South Side community leaders, business owners and residents are saying enough is enough.

As a diverse group of residents from Woodlawn, Washington Park, South Shore, Grand Crossing and other South Side neighborhoods, we are tired of groups such as Protect our Parks (POP) opposing the authentic voice of our community in its relentless opposition to the Obama Presidential Center.

Each time you are defeated in a court of law, you engage in another meritless appeal meant to stall, delay, and ultimately stop the construction of the Obama Presidential Center. In the meantime, construction costs are rising and residents who could be working on the site remain jobless.

We are outraged by this continued pattern of paternalism by a minority of naysayers, some of whom don't even live in Chicago, who believe their privilege trumps our will. We have the creativity and expertise to design and transform our neighborhoods through our unique cultural lens. We don't need you selective preservationists to speak for us!

POP and Jackson Park Watch care more about trees and traffic than they do about the lives of people who are impacted by decades of systemic disinvestment, job loss, poverty, and limited economic opportunity. Each lawsuit, appeal and publicity stunt is just another tactic to delay and thwart our ability to revitalize our community and create a legacy for our children. Your actions reflect a settler's mentality aiming to exclude the legitimate voices of the majority while elevating your own, no matter how much you have to twist the truth to do so.

As neighbors, taxpayers, and stakeholders from all walks of life, we welcome the Obama Center to the South Side, in general, and Jackson Park, in particular. This center will be the only state-of-the-art facility on the South Side that houses a public library, a technology center, arts & cultural activities, a museum, and a comprehensive array of programs designed to inform and inspire our youth and families.

Jackson Park is a living thing, a beacon for the future, not a graveyard for the past. Its legacy is still a work in progress. It belongs to all of us, not just the thousands of Black faces that live and work on the city's South Side, but all of Chicago and the world. In recent weeks, we have heard the cry of the oppressed in protest. They are tired of their shared dreams being undermined and held hostage by a privileged few who are detached from, and blind to, their plight. You obstructionists represent still one more foot on our collective necks!

We applaud Mayor Lori Lightfoot and the Chicago City Council for voting to fund a Woodlawn neighborhood improvement plan. These dollars will go a long way in assuring that current homeowners, renters, and businesses are not displaced and have the resources they need to maintain their properties.

This is a watershed moment in our nation's history. People all over the country are working to dismantle systems that have perpetuated racial hostility and social colonization. We don't need more paternalism disguised as community advocacy. If POP calls itself a friend of the community, then it should respect our right to self-determination. Stop Popping Off and start Protecting the rights of the People.

Efforts like this succeeded in running the Lucas Museum out of town, but WE SHALL NOT BE MOVED!
